2. It adds value and dignity to human life. We live in a secular culture that contributes to our sense of inner worthlessness. The church counteracts this negative message by preaching God's love and acceptance.
3. It provides a moral and spiritual compass. Society has revised, resisted and rejected absolutes, embracing relativism, but the church stands on the timeless bedrock of God's Word.
4. It's where you find compassion, healing, and community. There - we're all on par. There - God's Spirit is working to knit us together as believers, guaranteeing us all "equal access to the Father" (Eph. 2:18).
5. Unlike other institutions, it has motivated the most lasting, unselfish, essential, courageous endeavors on earth, things like missions, schools, hospitals, food pantries, rehab centers, and orphanages.

So, yes, I am committed to the church. I believe attending and being part of church is good for me... and you! Let's make 2018 the best year for Hope Church. This can only happen when/if the people of Hope are committed to the very things Jesus died for!
